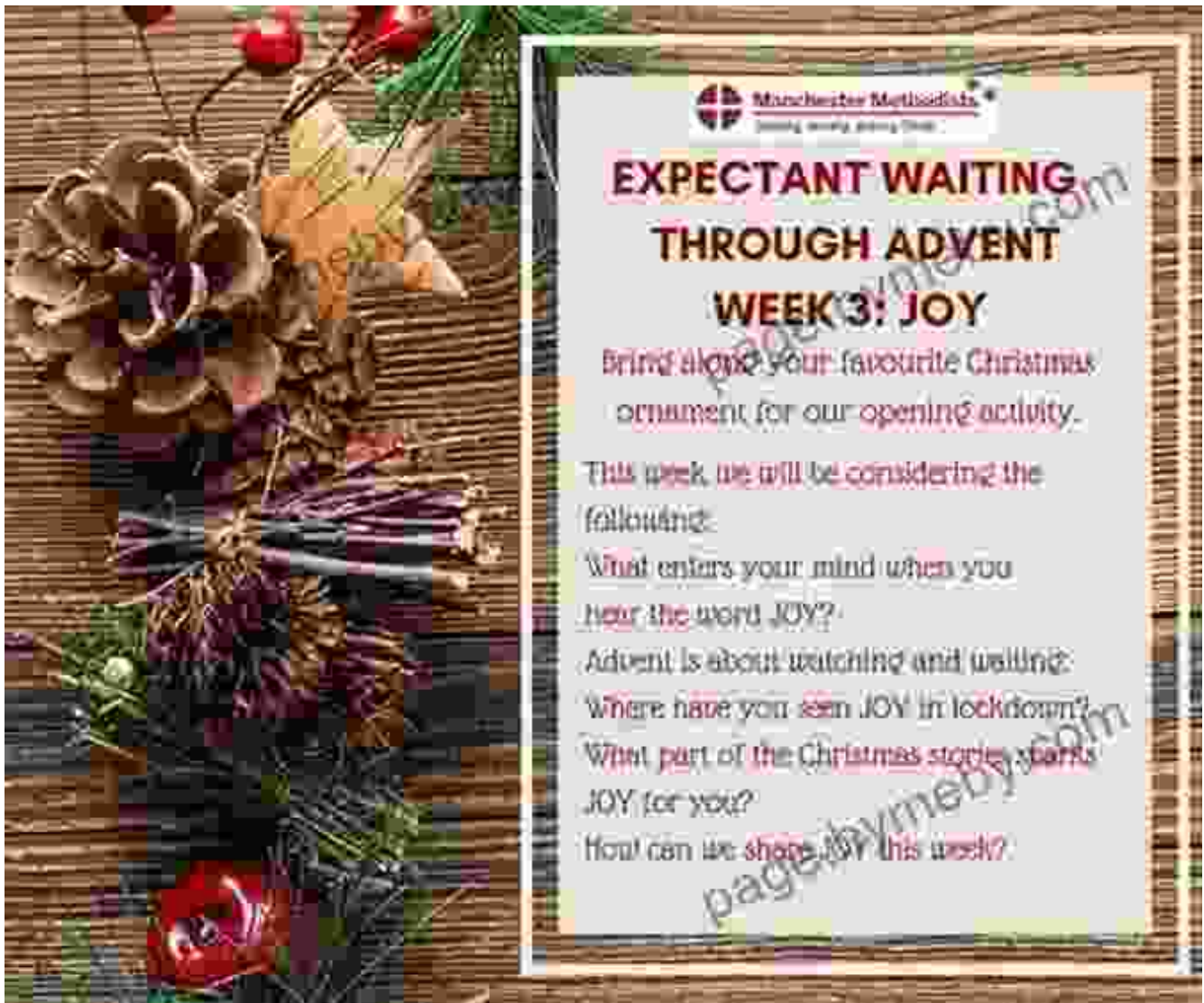

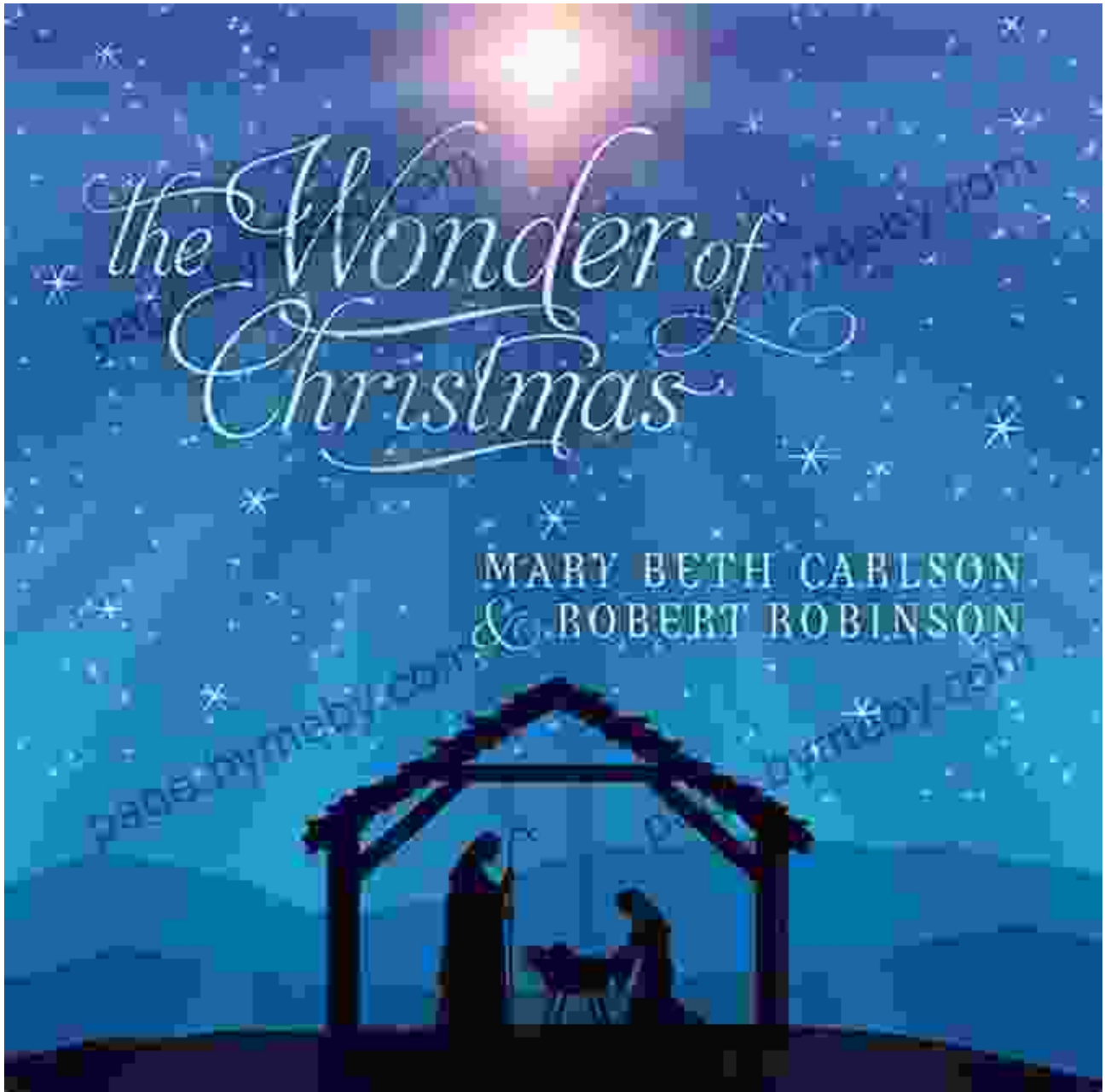

4. Theophany



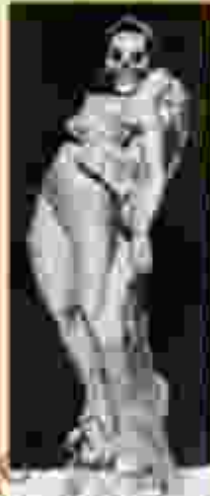

4. A composite carving of The heads of the Beckett sisters (gave as farewell gift to the Beckett sisters)

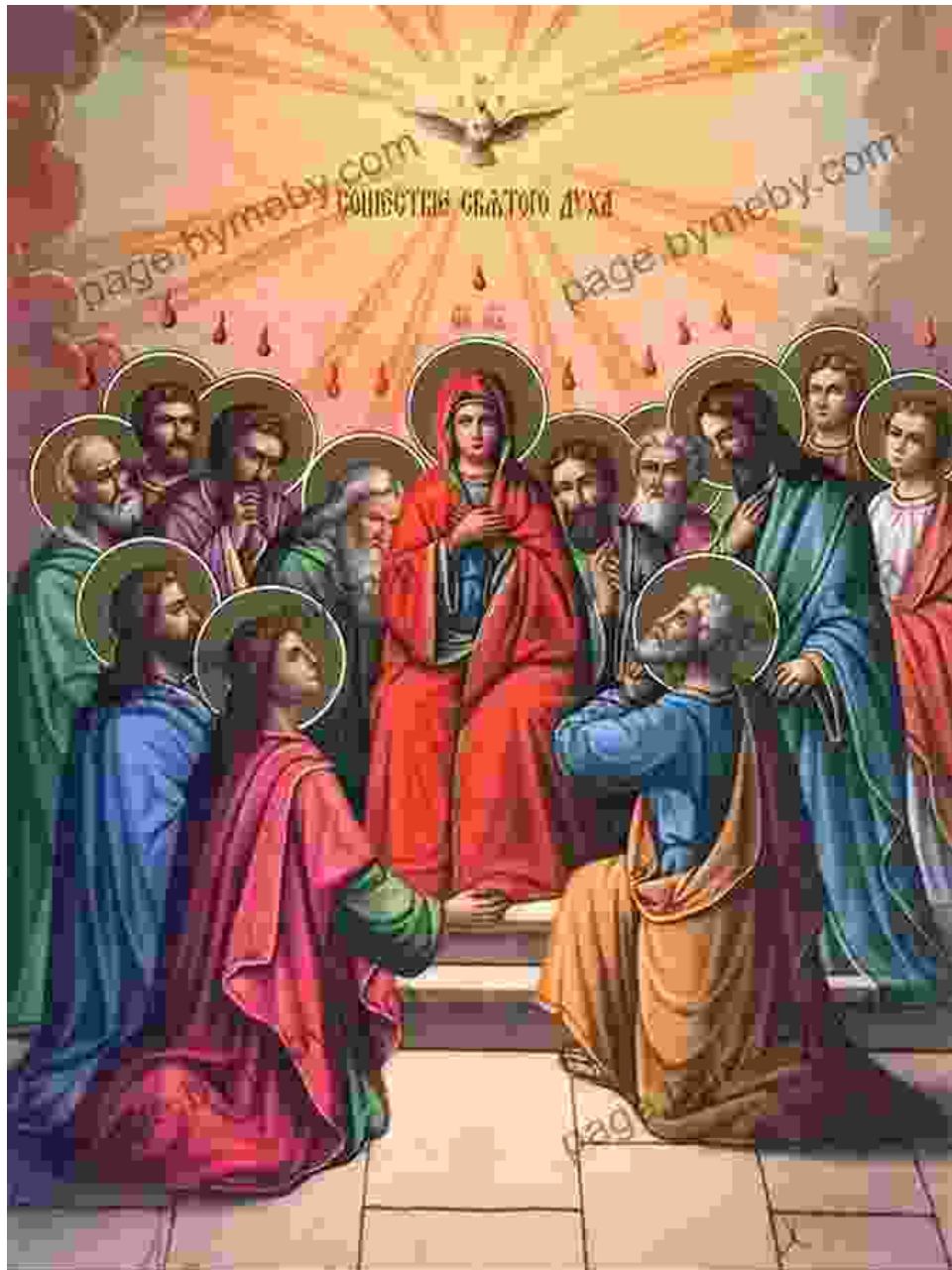

9. Nativity of the Theotokos



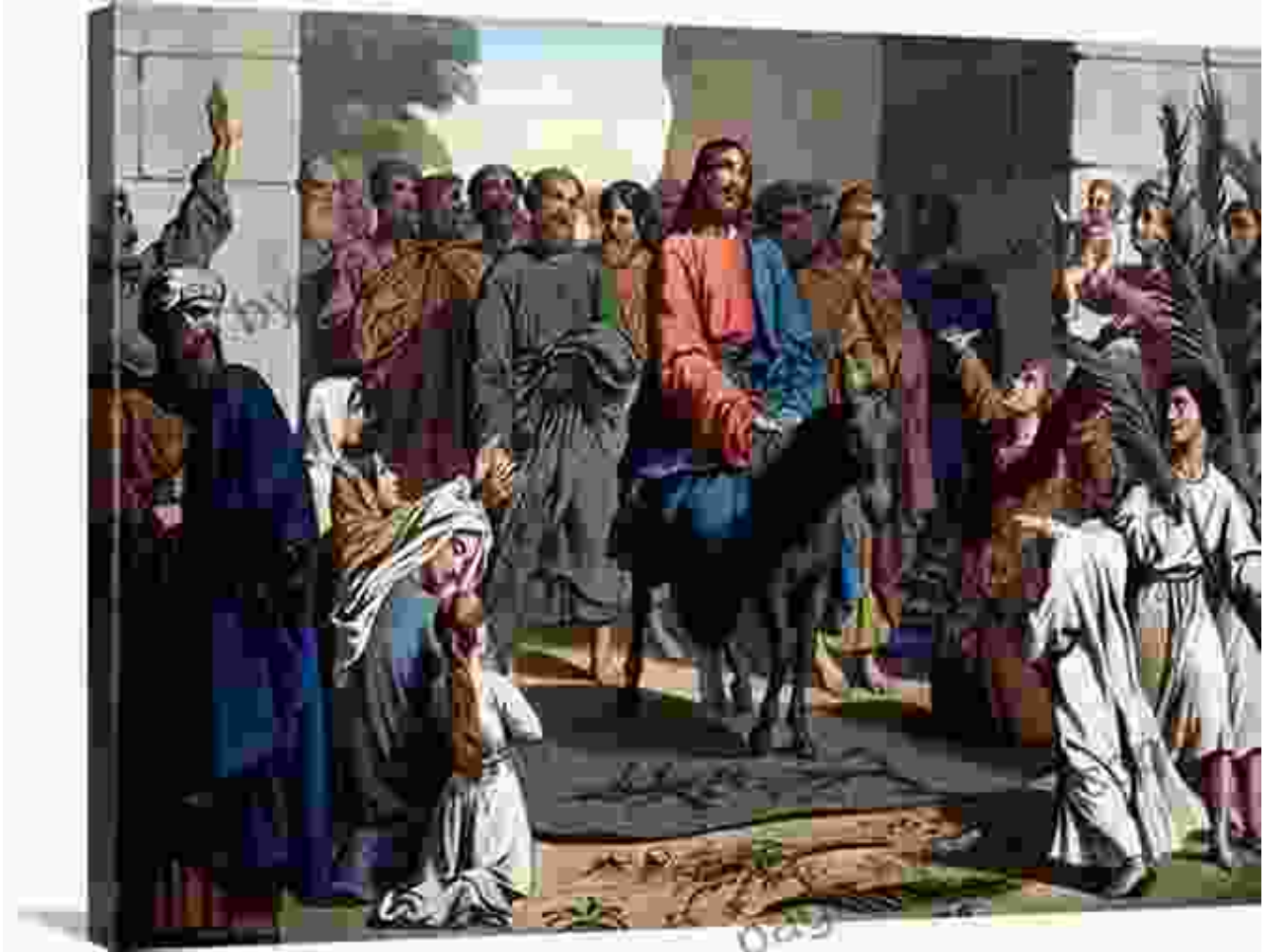

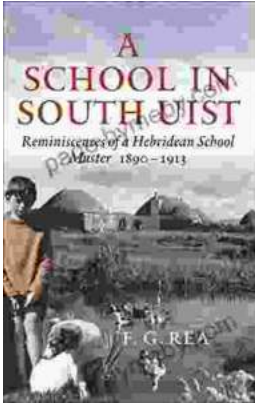
